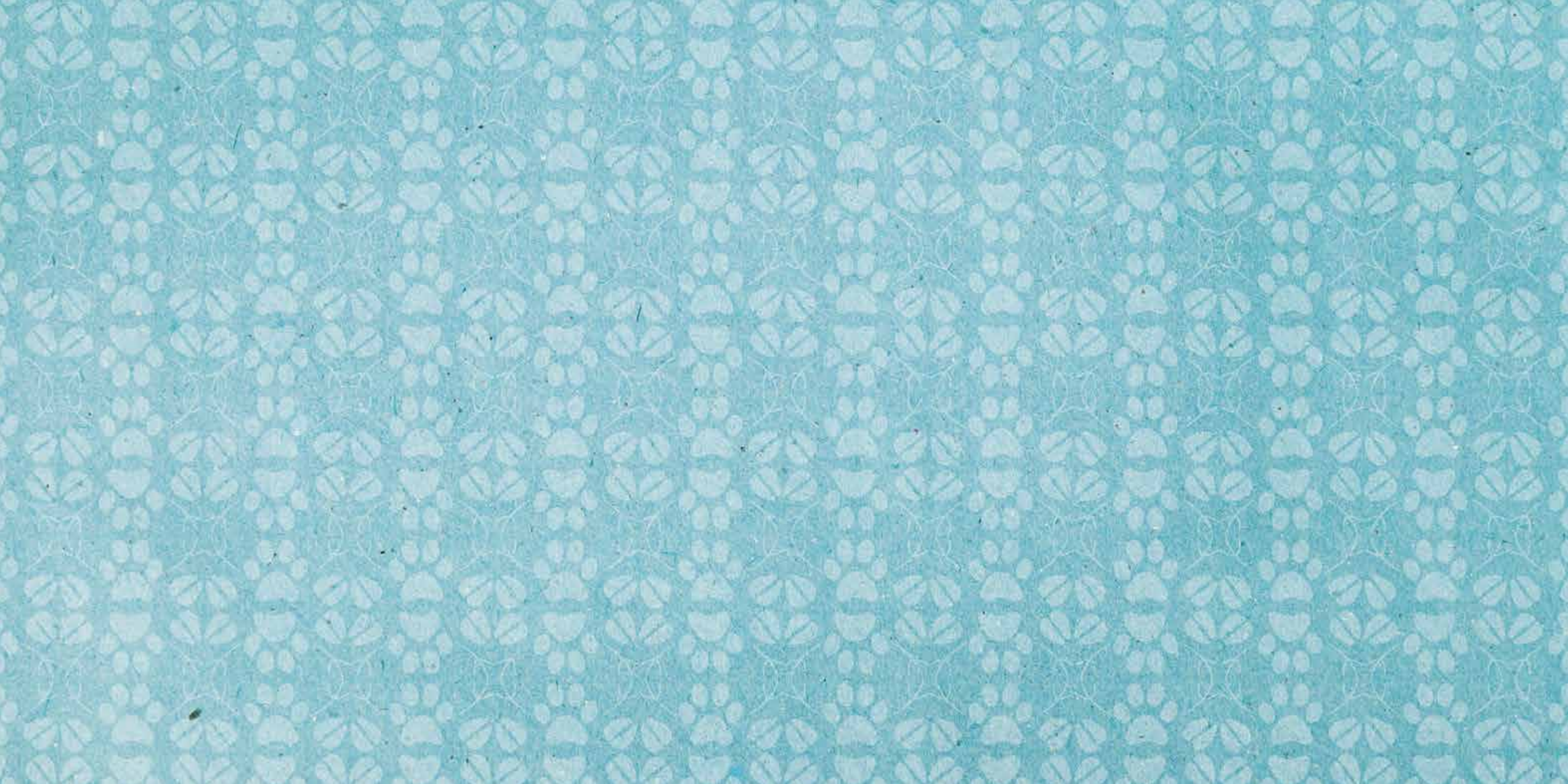

“Let’s have a picnic by the river.”

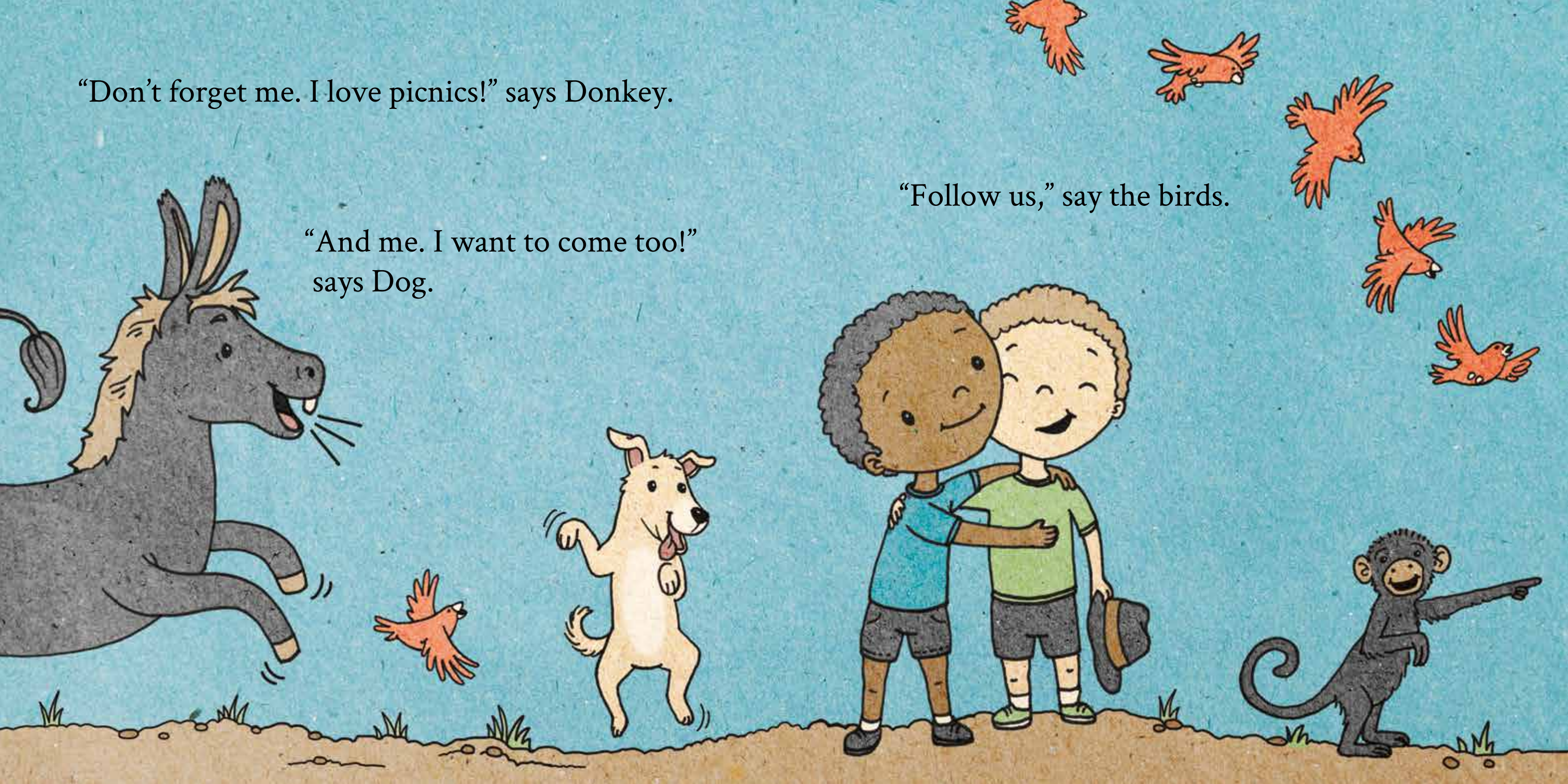


“Can my friend Jacob come?” asks Nicholas.

“Don’t forget me. I love picnics!” says Donkey.

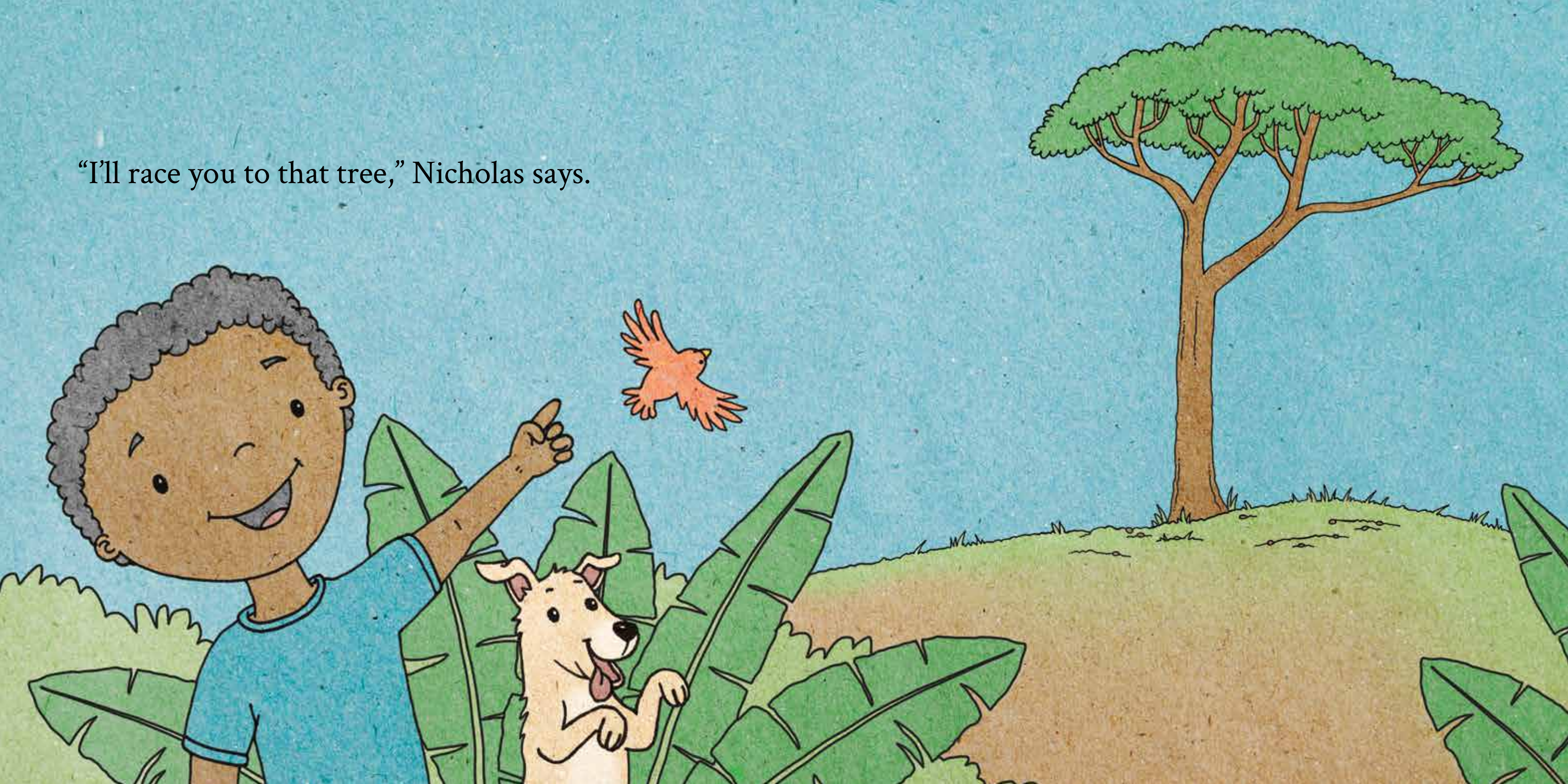
“And me. I want to come too!”

“Follow us,” say the birds.



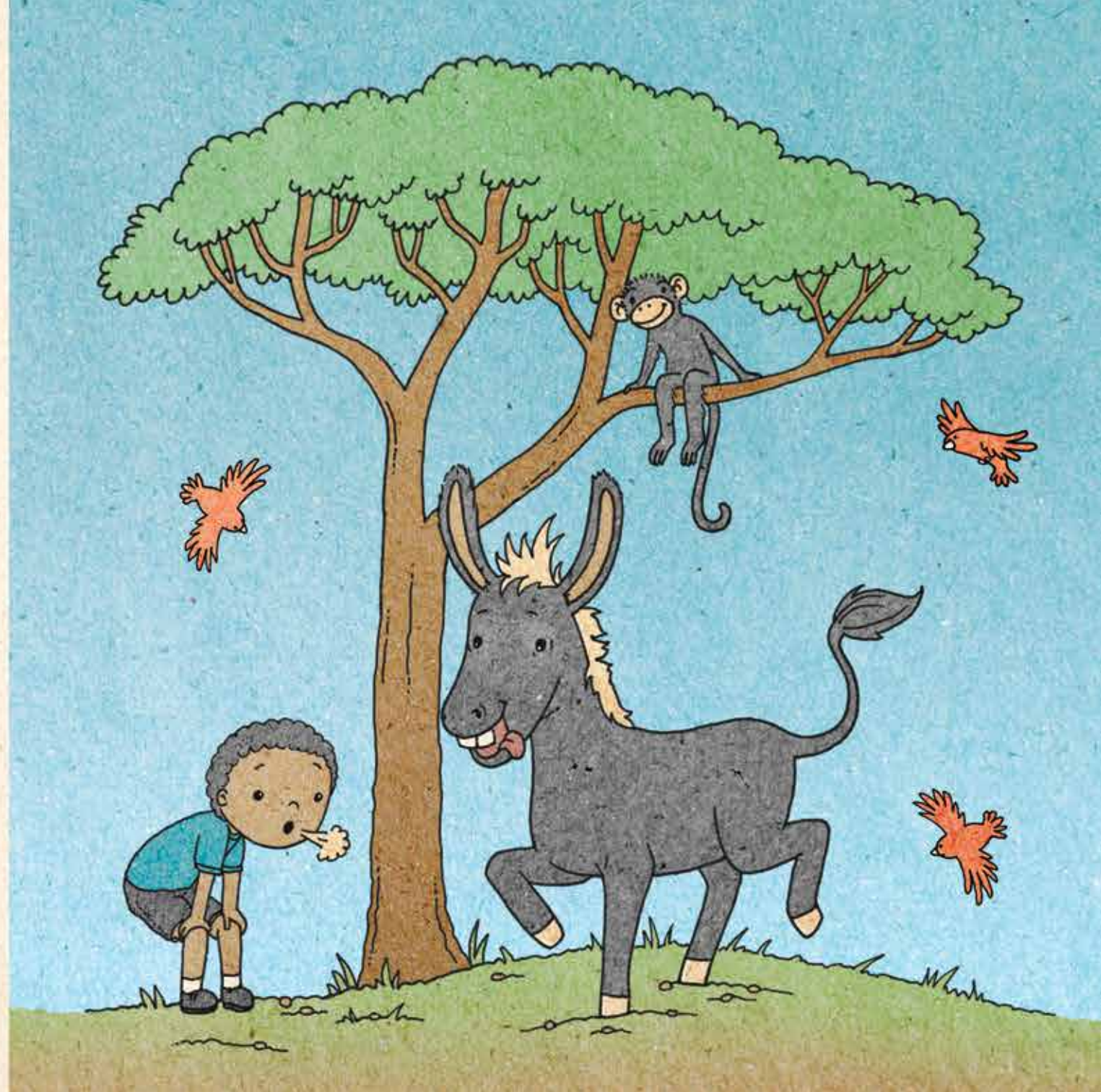


“I’ll race you to that tree,” Nicholas says.



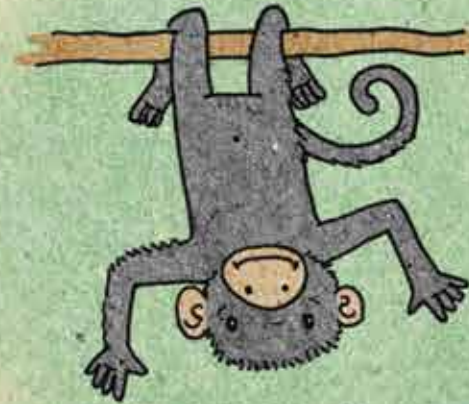
“I won, I won,” says Donkey.

says Nicholas.

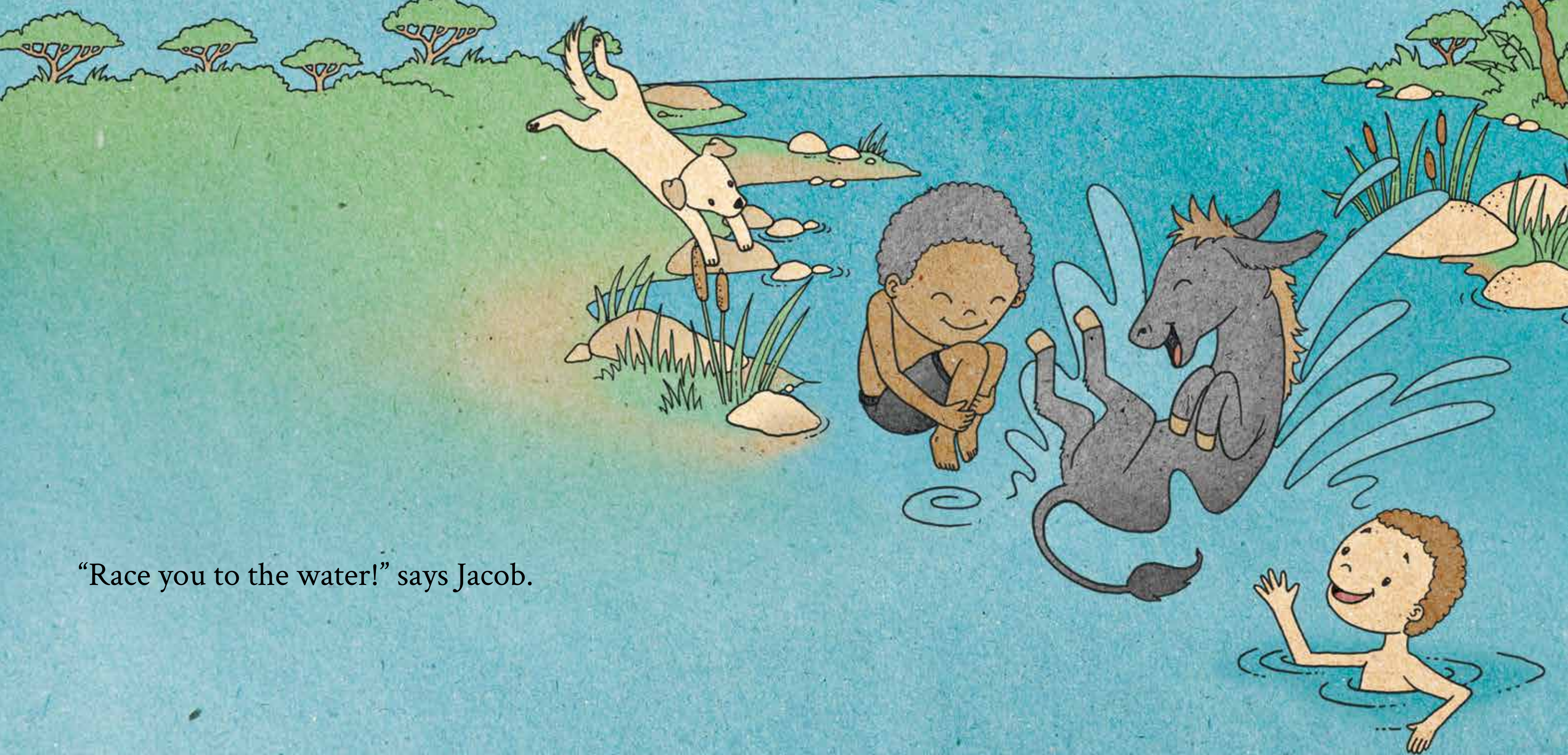


“I bet you can’t do this,” says Jacob.



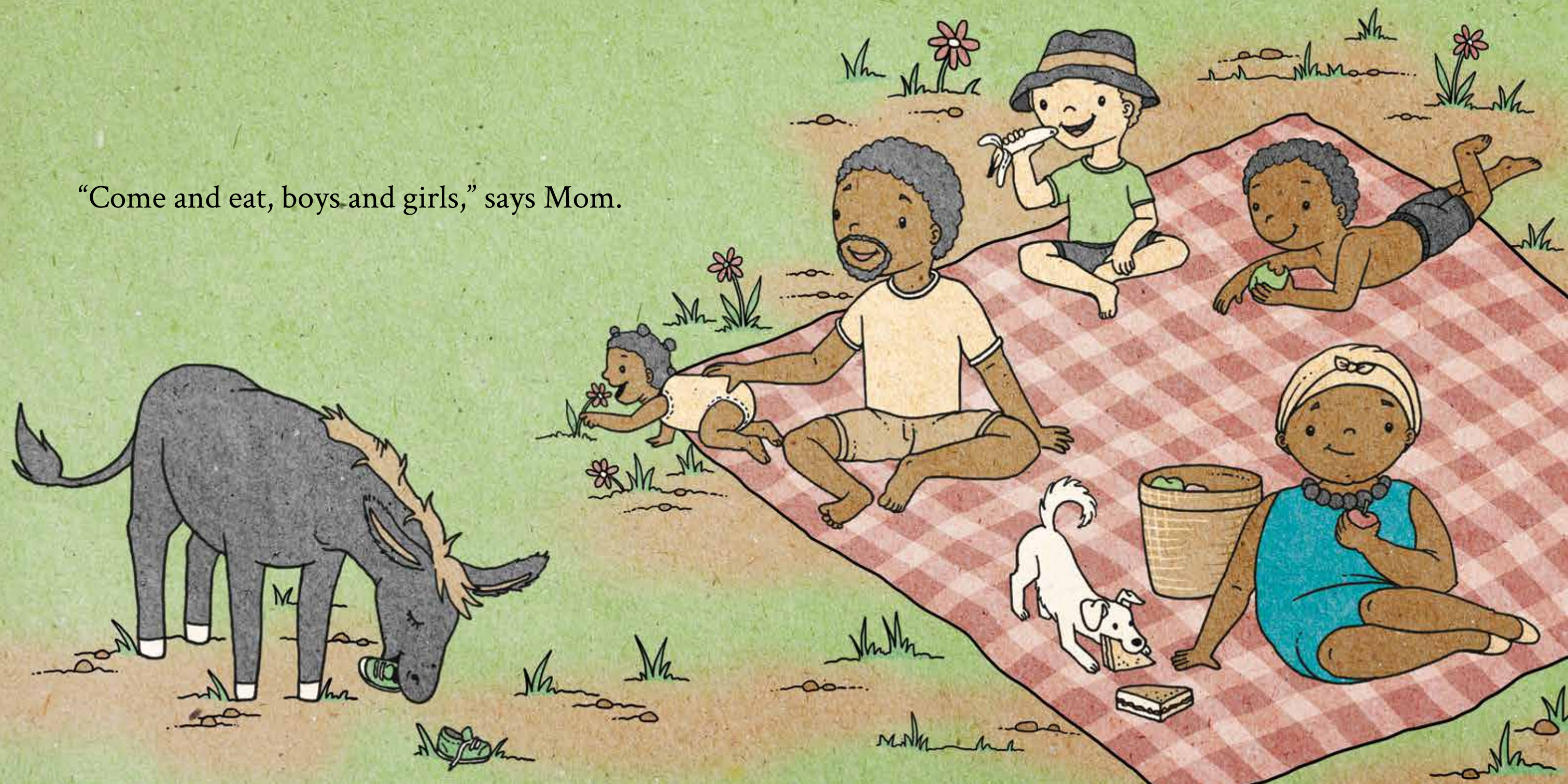
“Here’s our picnic spot,”
says Dad.

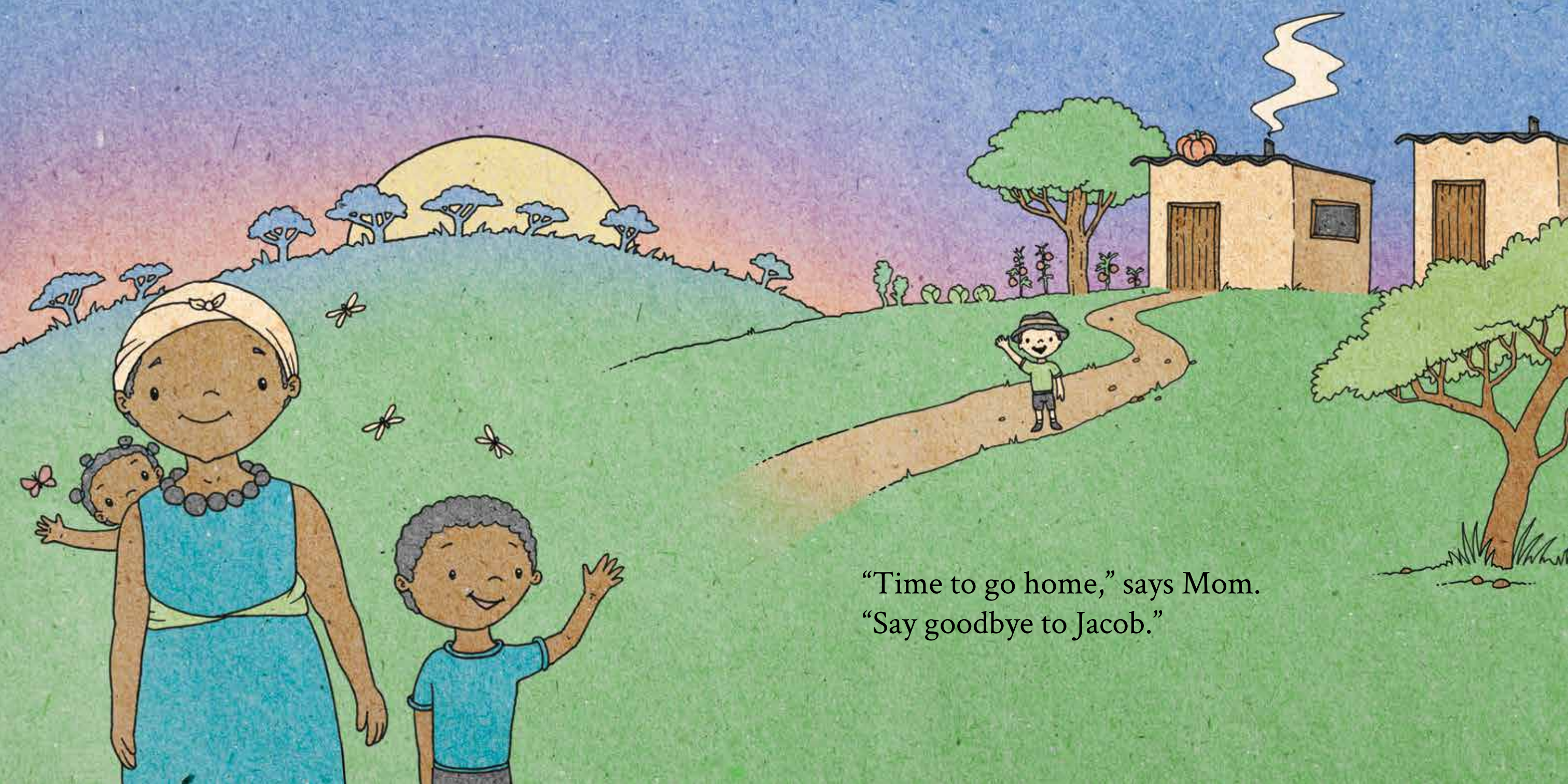




“Race you to the water!” says Jacob.
